Regular meetings of the Board of Directors will be held on the last Wednesday Tuesday of each calendar month, at 7:30 p.m. in the main fire house in Albion, California. The agenda will be posted 72 hours prior to all regular meetings.

Special meetings (non-emergency) of the Board of Directors may be called by the Board Chairman or a majority of the members of the Board.

All Directors, the Fire Department Chief, and necessary staff will be notified by mail or e-mail or in person twenty-four (24) hours prior to any special (non-emergency) meeting.

Only those items of business listed in the call for the special meeting will be considered by the Board at any special meeting.

Special emergency meetings: In the event of emergency involving matters upon which prompt action is required, the Board of Directors may hold an emergency special meeting without prior public notice.

All rules governing a special meeting will be observed with the exception of the twenty-four (24) hours notice. "The minutes of the emergency special meeting, roll call, and any action taken at such meetings will be posted at the main fire station for a minimum of ten (10) days as soon after approval by a majority of the Board as possible.

Public Notice of Board Meetings All regular, special (non-emergency) meetings or special (emergency) meetings will conform to the Ralph M. Brown Act (California Government Code 54950 et. Seq. 54926).

Adjourned meetings: A majority vote by the Board of Directors may adjourn any Board Meeting at any place in the agenda, to any time and place specified in the order of adjournment. Exception: If no directors are present at any regular meeting, the Chairman may declare the meeting adjourned to a stated time and place, and he or she will cause a written notice of adjournment to be given to all board members, the Fire Chief, and posted in the public place customarily utilized for other regular board postings.

- 54954. (a) Each legislative body of a local agency, except for advisory committees or standing committees, shall provide, by ordinance, resolution, bylaws, or by whatever other rule is required for the conduct of business by that body, the time and place for holding regular meetings. Meetings of advisory committees or standing committees, for which an agenda is posted at least 72 hours in advance of the meeting pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 54954.2, shall be considered for purposes of this chapter as regular meetings of the legislative body.
- (b) Regular and special meetings of the legislative body shall be held within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction, except to do any of the following:
- (1) Comply with state or federal law or court order, or attend a judicial or administrative proceeding to which the local agency is a party.
- (2) Inspect real or personal property which cannot be conveniently brought within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction provided that the topic of the meeting is limited to items directly related to the real or personal property.
- (3) Participate in meetings or discussions of multiagency significance that are outside the boundaries of a local agency's jurisdiction. However, any meeting or discussion held pursuant to this subdivision shall take place within the jurisdiction of one of the participating local agencies and be noticed by all participating agencies as provided for in this chapter.
- (4) Meet in the closest meeting facility if the local agency has no meeting facility within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction, or at the principal office of the local agency if that office is located outside the territory over which the agency exercises jurisdiction.
- (5) Meet outside their immediate jurisdiction with elected or appointed officials of the United States or the State of California when a local meeting would be impractical, solely to discuss a legislative or regulatory issue affecting the local agency and over which the federal or state officials have jurisdiction.
- (6) Meet outside their immediate jurisdiction if the meeting takes place in or nearby a facility owned by the agency, provided that the topic of the meeting is limited to items directly related to the facility.
- (7) Visit the office of the local agency's legal counsel for a closed session on pending litigation held pursuant to Section 54956.9, when to do so would reduce legal fees or costs.
- (c) Meetings of the governing board of a school district shall be held within the district, except under the circumstances enumerated in subdivision (b), or to do any of the following:
- (1) Attend a conference on nonadversarial collective bargaining techniques.
- (2) Interview members of the public residing in another district with reference to the trustees' potential employment of an applicant for the position of the superintendent of the district.
 - (3) Interview a potential employee from another district.
- (d) Meetings of a joint powers authority shall occur within the territory of at least one of its member agencies, or as provided in subdivision (b). However, a joint powers authority which has members throughout the state may meet at any facility in the state which complies with the requirements of Section 54961.

GSRMA Joint Powers Agreement (JPA)/Bylaws Summary

(The following is a short summary of the pending JPA/Bylaws Revision as presented by GSRMA Risk Manager Scott Schimke.)

I will break my summary down into two parts. The first part deals with making the existing JPA and Bylaws more reader friendly. The second part will address the substantive additions to the JPA and Bylaws.

The original JPA and Bylaws were drafted in 1979. Over the course of the last 30 years the legal world of risk sharing pools (such as GSRMA) has evolved. This evolution is the driving force behind the majority of the rewriting process. Specifically, we moved items contained in the JPA to the Bylaws and vice versa. This allows the proposed JPA to be a much more static document and relegate operational duties to the Bylaws. In addition we "cleaned up" or standardized terms within both documents, removed provisions or requirements that were no longer relevant to the overall operation, clarified the definitions of the words "claims", "city", "county", "PCA" and "special districts" and improved the overall grammar of both documents.

Basically, we made the proposed documents much easier to read and understand.

In regards to actual additions, the proposed documents will now allow the GSRMA Board to adopt a late payment policy (including the ability to add a finance charge to members who pay late) and to clarify that notice to members can now also be electronic (i.e. E-mail, website) as well as a written hard copy.

In summary, the proposed documents are more standardized, efficient and easier to understand. This will allow us to be more efficient in our service to our members.

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CALIFORNIA CODES
PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE
SECTION 20810-20813

20810. The provisions of this article shall apply to contracts by fire protection districts as provided for in the Fire Protection District Law pursuant to Division 12 (commencing with Section 13000) of the Health and Safety Code.

- 20811. When a district board determines that it is in the public interest, a district may **contract** with any other public agency for fire protection services, rescue services, emergency medical services, hazardous material emergency response services, ambulance services, and any other emergency services for the protection of lives and property.
- 20812. (a) A district board may contract for special services. These contracts shall be with persons specially trained, experienced, expert, and competent to perform the special services. The special services shall be limited to the fields of accounting, administration, ambulance, architecture, custodial, economics, engineering, finance, insurance, labor relations, law, maintenance, mechanics, medicine, planning, science, technology, and other services which are incidental to the operation of the district.
- (b) In the case of a district which has a final budget in excess of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), the district shall follow the contracting and purchasing procedures which apply to the county government of its principal county or the procedures in subdivision (c).
- (c) In the case of a district which has a final budget less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000), the district shall follow the procedures of this subdivision.
- (1) When the expenditure required for the service **contract** exceeds twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), it shall be contracted for and let to the lowest responsible bidder. If two or more bids are the same and the lowest, the district board may accept the one it chooses.
- (2) The notice inviting bids shall set a date for the opening of bids. The first publication or posting of the notice shall be at least 10 days before the date of opening the bids. Notice shall be published at least twice, at least five days apart, in a newspaper of general circulation in the district, or if there is none, it shall be posted in at least three public places in the district. The notice shall distinctly state the service to be performed.
- (3) The district board may reject any bids. If the district board rejects all bids, it may either readvertise or adopt a resolution, by two-thirds vote, declaring that the service can be performed more economically by the district's employees or obtained at a lower price in the open market. Upon adoption of the resolution, the district board may undertake the service **contract** without further complying with this section.
- (4) If no bids are received, the district board may undertake the service **contract** without further complying with this section.
 - (5) In the case of an emergency, the district board shall respond

to the emergency pursuant to Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 22050) if notice for bids to let contracts will not be given.

20813. (a) All contracts for the construction or completion of any building, structure, or improvement, when the expenditure required for the work exceeds ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), shall be contracted for and let to the lowest responsible bidder after notice.

If two or more bids are the same and the lowest, the district board may accept the one it chooses.

- (b) The notice inviting bids shall set a date for the opening of bids. The first publication or posting of the notice shall be at least 10 days before the date of opening the bids. Notice shall be published at least twice, not less than five days apart, in a newspaper of general circulation in the district, or if there is none, it shall be posted in at least three public places in the district. The notice shall distinctly state the work to be done.
- (c) In its discretion, the district board may reject any bids presented and readvertise.
- (d) In the case of an emergency, the district board may act pursuant to Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 22050).
- (e) The district board may, subject to the provisions of Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 3247) of Title 15 of Part 4 of Division 3 of the Civil Code, require the posting of those bonds it deems desirable as a condition to the filing of a bid or the letting of a contract.
- (f) Cost records of the work shall be kept in the manner provided in Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 4000) of Division 5 of Title 1 of the Government Code.



Funds in both LAIF and CAMP are accessible with same-day notice.
